
Auto & Business Travel Deductions

- If you wish to take a deduction for usage of your automobile, it is strongly advised that you have a mileage log.
- Even if you take a percentage of your actual expenses rather than the standard mileage rate, per the IRS, you must maintain mileage records in order to figure out your business use percentage.
- A mileage log can be in writing or there are smartphone applications (apps) available that will automatically track your mileage for you.
- When taking a deduction for business travel, please ensure the travel in question had a legitimate business purpose.
